## Editorial

# **A Christmas Thought**



The war had stretched on for so many years, followed by famine and failed crops 'the year without a summer' people called it. As dark and bitter winter nights set in many were feeing exhausted, anxious, hungry, poor in spirit as well as in pocket. In the mountain village of Oberndorf the congregation at the Nikolauskirche (the church of St Nicholas) was preparing for Christmas. Legend has it that on Christmas Eve the priest at St Nicholas discovered that, due either to the ravages of mice or recent flooding, the organ was unplayable. So just to add to all the gloom no music at the mid-night Mass. Father Joseph Mohr had recently written a poem to try to convey a little hope and encouragement to his congregation and with the help of organist Franz Gruber the poem was set to music and sung by the two friends and a small choir accompanied by Joseph on his guitar. Thus 'Stille Nacht' was performed for the first time at the Christmas Mid-night Mass in 1818. It immediately became popular and in 1858 was translated into English as Silent Night.

Since then, it has been translated into over 300 languages, recorded over 137,000 times and consistently remains among the top 3 favourite carols of all time. On Christmas day 1915 in the middle of the trenches of the First World War a German soldier began to sing Stille Nacht and troops on both sides of the conflict set down their arms and joined in the singing. Over 200 years after it was written in the midst of our busy, commercialized rush towards Christmas whenever the carol is sung whether in shopping centres, carol services or at Mid-night communion on Christmas Eve the words and the simple but beautiful melody have a way of weaving their own magic.

At its heart is a message of light and peace, a peace that comes into the world in the form of a tiny baby named Jesus, (literally meaning 'God saves'). As he grows up, he will become known as the Prince of Peace and the Light of the World. Jesus was born into a world of mess and muddle, war, famine, suffering and anxiety much like the world of Joseph Mohr's day and much like the world of our day. Over the course of the run up to Christmas we may hear the words of Silent Night many times, we may even have the chance to sing them. I suggest that when we do, we might like to pause and reflect on the places of conflict among the nations, in our communities, in our own lives, and make a prayer that the light, hope and healing that Jesus brings may be born afresh into our world. Without him we're in the dark but with his light we need never be afraid because his light can outshine all the darkness.

May I wish you all a very Happy and Peaceful Christmas.

### **Report of the Queen Camel Parish Council**

The Parish Council (PC) met on 18 November 2024. There was a long agenda of which the following should be noted:

- roads, drains and kerb gutters. Somerset Council (SC) have limited resources so please report any issues you note on the roads and drains around the village to Highways and at the same time advise the Parish Clerk so that the PC can monitor remedial progress. Also can everyone do as much as they can to keep the area outside their houses as clear of growth, weeds and leaves; a small amount of effort by each of us should help keep the village streets and roads much tidier; we cannot expect much from SC.
- neighbourhood planning (NP). The working group for NP reported on its engagement with SC planning over the long outstanding planning application for new housing behind South View and for the overall development of that part of the village. We are trying to ensure there is a coordinated plan.
- the Flood Committee reported on the draft Section 19 report which had been received from SC. The PC agreed to a robust response to SC to what seemed a very inadequate draft which did not even explain why so much water came down the Cam on 9 May 2023.
- there was an initial discussion on the **budget and proposed precept** for 2025/26. SC have written to all parishes advising that more services may be devolved and contingencies should be built into budgets. The government has stated that local authority council taxes can be raised by 5%. No decisions will be made till the January PC meeting, but the PC is mindful that it may have to pick up more services from SC.
- there were further discussions on **road safety.** There seem to be three elements involved in Queen Camel: volume of traffic, HGVs and speeding. There was no clear conclusion on what should be done which would be cost effective. Tracking HGVs breaking the weight limit and knowing what the incidence of speeding is require clear evidence, if anything further is to be done, such as installing SIDs or extending the 20mph limit. The PC agreed that a working group should be established to review these issues further. As well as those who gave their names at the 2 October meeting, if anyone can help on this issue and even lead a **Speed Watch** team, can you let me or any councillor know.
- there was a discussion on providing a **village storage unit**, but opinions were very divided as to whether it was necessary, even if a suitable site could be found and it was not clear how it would be managed longer term. It was suggested that, should a new community centre or pavilion ever be built, a dedicate storage room might then be provided for local clubs to rent.
- The next PC meeting is on **20 January 2025**. Please let me or any councillor have any comments on the matters mentioned or those you wish to raise.

Can I, on behalf of the PC, wish everyone a very happy and peaceful Christmas and New Year.

**Bottle Tops** 

### The collection of Bottle Tops will cease at the end of 2024.

Donations have decreased considerably since Covid: in 2019 we delivered 700kg of bottle tops to Perry's Recycling in Marston Magna as against 120kg this year. With regular recycling collections in the village and a request for tops to be kept on bottles, the need to collect the tops separately has largely fallen away.

We have been collecting them for the past ten years and we have donated some £500 to the Dorset & Somerset Air Ambulance. Thank you very much to all of you who have saved bottle tops so diligently and have encouraged your work colleagues to do likewise as well as the local schools who have helped enormously.

Finally, a huge thank you to John Lye and Trisha Rylance who have sorted through bags and bags of bottle tops left in the old telephone box near the Supply Stores over many years.



## **Book Club review November 2024**

'Behind Closed Doors' by B A Paris was an uncomfortable read with some challenges to credibility, but it was a catalyst for serious discussion on the topic of abuse in Marriage. The extreme threat to Grace, the main character in the book, was difficult to conceive of in the current technological age, but it was a reminder to us that no one is immune from deception, and that there are predators out in the community who have intelligence and social graces. Interesting that we were meeting in a week where the abuses by John Smyth have been so topical. As ever, our discussion expanded and drew on the experiences of many of us, in different walks of life. The novel is written in the first person, which gives one confidence that the main protagonist will survive.

Much of the writing was linear and rather lacking in variety of tempo and colour which some of us found turgid and repetitive. It is, however, a worthy read and scored between 5 and 8 with an average of 6+.






