Editorial

For the last few days I have been disappointed to find that our chickens seemed to have stopped laying.

If you have ever kept chickens you will know what a delight it is to have your own fresh free-range eggs but you will also be aware of some of the pitfalls.

One of these is predators. The hens themselves have one obvious predator, the fox, but there are also predators who, given the chance, will feast on freshly-laid eggs. Magpies and rats have given us the biggest problems and once they find the place where eggs are being laid, they are hard to stop.

So, my assumption was that something was stealing and eating the eggs. My suspicions were further aroused by the sight of a freshly dug rat tunnel under the chicken house. Having decided that I knew what the problem was I set about laying poison and blocking off any obvious rat holes.

And then this morning, having left the chickens in a bit longer to see if they would perform in the safety of their shed, the cupboard was once again bare. Muttering to my myself I redoubled my rat defences but then out of the corner of my eye I noticed one of our chickens had settled underneath an old bench and to one side of her there was an egg. Assuming she had just laid it I picked her up to discover a nest underneath containing nine eggs, all intact.

It seems that not a single egg had been eaten by a predator; the chickens had just got bored laying in the same old nesting box every day and had ventured somewhere new.

This experience made me realise how easily I jump to the wrong, and often negative, conclusions. Sometimes we have to think outside the (nesting) box and look beyond the obvious. Five minutes of standing still and watching where the chickens went to lay would have led me to discover what was happening.

As we approach the season of Lent I have been thinking about what I might do differently during those six weeks. Over the years I have tended to move away from giving things up and instead have looked for positive actions.

Spring is a season of renewal, a time when nature awakens from its winter slumber and bursts into life and it can be a time of gentle renewal for us as well.

There is a famous poem by W.H. Davies which opens with the line "what is this life if, full of care, we have no time to stand and stare?" and my hope this Lent is to give myself more time just to be and to appreciate the splendours of God's creation that abound in this wonderful season.

It might mean that I do actually have to give some things up; at the moment social media is top of my list, but my aim is to become more connected to the natural world around me and less connected to my phone and laptop.

Whatever plans you have between now and Easter I hope that you find a chance to enjoy the vibrant tapestry of colours, scents, and sounds that signal the first signs of spring and that they bring you a sense of hope and rejuvenation.

NOTICE OF PREPARATION OF NEW ELECTORAL ROLL

Parish of St Barnabas, Queen Camel
Notice is given that under the Church Representation Rules a new Church Electoral Roll* is being prepared. Every person who wishes to have his or her name entered on the new Roll, whether it is entered on the present Roll or not, is requested to apply for enrolment not later than 22^{nd} March 2025.
The new Roll will take effect on $\underline{5}^{th}$ April 2025
The new Roll will be published by the Parochial Church Council for at least 14 days and a copy of the Roll will be available for inspection on a reasonable request being made to the Council.
Under the Church Representation Rules, a lay person is entitled to have his or her name entered on the roll, if the person $-$
(a) is baptised,
(b) is aged 16 or over, and
(c) has made one of the following three declarations and duly applied for enrolment.
The first declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it and is resident in the parish.
The second declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it, is not resident in the parish, but has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.
The third declaration is that the person is a member in good standing of a Church which is not in communion with the Church of England but subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and is also a member of the Church of England and has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.
Application Forms for enrolment can be obtained from the Church Electoral Roll Officer. In order to be entitled to attend the annual parochial church meeting and to take part in its proceedings, you must return the Application Form for enrolment by the earlier of the dates given above.
Any error discovered in the roll should at once be reported to the Church Electoral Roll Officer.

Report of the Queen Camel Parish Council



There was no scheduled meeting of the Parish Council (PC) in February 2025, though the PC has conducted some urgent planning business with an Extraordinary meeting. The main issues arising in the month are familiar ones:

- HGVs and Hopkins' lorries. A enthusiastic and lively working group has been monitoring the movements of HGVs through the village, compiling information to support the complaints to the authorities about the unreasonable and anti social behaviour of the very significant HGV activity. In order to make these surveys valid and useful they will continue to be done on a random basis. Cllr Nicola Clark, whose Somerset Council (SC) division includes Sutton Montis, has followed up on the 4 Parish Councils chairmen's letter. SC Highways have also been provided with more information. This remains a difficult and frustrating issue on which pressure will have to be maintained on all parties who can take action to stop the unreasonable HGV movements.
- A number of Highways issues including potholes and blocked drains remain high on the complaints list. Any parishioner making a complaint to SC also advise the PC so that a comprehensive follow up list can be maintained. Some repairs have been carried out such as on the A359 bridge and work on Wales Bridge to strengthen and then resurface it is scheduled to start soon.
- In spite of some very wet weather the village just escaped flooding, though the A359 was closed briefly at the bridge, at the end of January. SC published its S19 report on the May 2023 flood which did not add significantly to our knowledge. Currently all the river gauges can be viewed via RiverApp and they will shortly be available on Pegel which has an alarm function which triggers at given river levels.
- Dialogue continues with the SC planners and the developers on the S106 agreement for the development of the land off West Camel Road behind South View..
- Cherry Toop has resigned as Parish Clerk to allow her more time for family commitments. David Lowe also resigned as a Councillor on account of personal commitments. My thanks go to both of them for their contributions to the PC. Anyone wishing to be considered for either position should go to the PC website or contact me or any councillor for more details.
- The next PC meeting is on 24 March 2025, a week later than usual. The Annual Village Meeting has been set for Friday, 16 May.

Please let me or any councillor have any comments on the matters mentioned or those you wish to raise.

Appointment of Clerk and Responsible Finance Officer

Applications are invited for the position of Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer (RFO) for Queen Camel Parish Council.

The Clerk is responsible for organising meetings of the Council and assisting the Chairman.

Responsibilities include: administration of Council's paperwork and governance (including policies), advice on procedure and implementing instructions of Council. As RFO, the Clerk is responsible for financial management of Council using SCRIBE online software and ensuring full transparency and accountability.

Attendance would be required at the Council meetings, which are usually held on the third Monday of the month in approximately 6 months of the year in Queen Camel Memorial Hall at 19.30.

The Clerk works from home and office expenses are paid, with a laptop and printer supplied. The hours average 12 per week. Salary is dependent on qualifications and experience currently based on the upper LC 1 and lower LC2 pay scales ranging from £14.60 to £16.65 per hour. There is a home working allowance of £26.00 a month.

The Clerk is responsible for updating the Queen Camel Parish Council website. Experience of website management will be an advantage. The Council wishes to expand its use of online newsletters and experience of creating these (or a willingness to learn) will also be useful.



My son, my son, by Howard Spring, published in the 1930s, was a challenging read, mainly because of the density of the prose, which was written in a formal narrative style. Spring wrote the novel using the first person voice of a rather remote and tragic character. It was a slow boiler of a novel weaving in the threads of tragedy from the start. However, it is notable that everyone in the Book Group had finished reading it. Once you acclimatize to the style it is a very satisfying read.... For most of us. 36 members and 2 visitors enjoyed a whistlestop tour of "Animals in Art" from 1515 to the present day. Richard Kay from Lawrences Auctioneers was our speaker. And we were all enthralled.

I expect you have all seen Durer's woodcut of a Rhino? What you may not realise is that Durer had nevereseen a Rhinoceros. He had only been given a description and brief sketch of an Indian Rhino brought to Lisebon in 1515 as a gift to the Portuguese King Manuel. The King didn't want it and shipped it off to Pope Leon X, but it died in a shipwreck before reaching Italy.

Marmaduke Craddock was born in 1660, and always lived in Somerset. He was distinguished for his oil paint ings of groups of British birds. Oils was a far more difficult media then, than it is now.

We have all appreciated George Stubbs {1724 to 1806} depictions of horses. But we learnt that Stubbs would collect dead horses, drag them into his home and cut them up on the kitchen table so he could study the anatomy more closely. Sometimes the carcass would remain on the table for weeks!...Needless to say, Stubbs never married.

John Constable, again known to all of us, needed a regular income so would do portraits. He painted Wile liam, Mary and George Lambert. Their Grandfather was supposed to be in the painting as he was to keep the children amused. This didn't work, so Constable replaced Grandfather with a donkey which saved the day.

Landseer painted the "Monarch of the Glen" in 1851, and he sculpted the lions at the base of Nelson's Col umn. He also taught Queen Victoria. However he had serious mental problems, was declared insane in 1872
 and died soon after.

We learnt about so many painters, but I will end with Sir Peter Scott, the naturalist.

He was asked to paint the Loch Ness Monster. He did a wonderful painting of two long necked large bodied
 amphibians in 1975. From then on, many people believed that the Loch Ness monster was real. Do you?


